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Team Leaders

Recruiting People

Team members can be anybody—friends, family, co-workers, or neighbours.—and whether you're an individual, corporate team or a team of family and friends, just be sure to ask everyone you know to join your team! It's the key to successful fundraising!

Raising Money

Fundraising comes more naturally when you make it personal. Be willing to tell your story. You can post your story on your team's webpage. Don't forget to ask everyone who sponsors you if their employer offers matching gifts. This is a great way to double or even triple your fundraising efforts!

Having a Great Time!

Being a team leader is an opportunity to share a great experience with friends and family members, or co-workers. It's always great seeing a community coming together for a common goal and the accomplishment of a unique personal challenge! As a team leader, it's up to you to remind your teammates of why they registered and keep them motivated to make the best of their fundraising attempts. Make it fun and remember enjoying the success together along the way can be a joyous celebration of how far you have come as a team!

Goal Setting

Establishing a goal is a perfect way to maintain motivation as well as give you and your team a benchmark for success. We encourage team leaders to set goals for themselves and their teams, while keeping these tips in mind:

- Goals should be realistic, but significant; if it requires hard work to attain, it will be a source of more pride for your team.
- Don't arbitrarily set a goal without input from the team. Having them believe in the goal from the word "go" will make your job as team leader that much easier.
- Don't forget to set both a personal and a team fundraising goal. Lead by example.
- Set a goal for team size as well as collective fundraising. Recruiting more team members can mean more substantial fundraising!
- Don't keep your goal a secret! Use-email, team pages, and even internal company intranets, social networking sites and newsletters to communicate goals.

There are four key elements to becoming a successful team leader.


- 1. Set a great example

Encourage team members to use their online pages

Once you see what the tools can do for you, encourage your team members to use them. Make it fun by giving incentives to your team members to fundraise online. Be creative and ensure that your team not only reaches their goals, but has a great time in the process.

Recruit members online

Have people join your team from your team page, or just send them a registration link via e-mail. You can also download your contact list from most of the popular email services directly into the tool.




Team Leaders Fundraising Area

Teams are made up of individual fundraisers. Teams have their own fundraising sites, managed by a team leader. The team leader has access to the site to make changes, and all team members can see the site information. One of the most important roles for a team leader is to set a great example, so use your own fundraising page and send out lots of emails requesting donations and encourage your team mates to do the same.

Team Pages

Team sites are automatically created when, during the registration process, an individual opts to Start a Team. This participant is then designated to be the Team Leader. Only the team leader has special access to customize the team fundraising page, by logging into their password-protected account. All team members can view the team page, but only the team leader can make changes to the name and description. Every time the team adds a new member, the member's fundraising results are added to the team's Web page.



Here is where you can change the teams' name, fundraising goal and team recruitment goal. Further down, you can customize the team page message.

Team Pages - Features

It's really important to add a team photo. They are also shown on the team listing page. This adds a personal touch to your team page, and allows donors to feel more connected to the participants on the team.



Team pages are setup a lot like personal pages. There is a headline, the teams' message and a thermometer showing the fundraising progress. Each member is listed separately so people can choose which team member they would like to sponsor. There is also a link people can click on if they want to join your team.

Team Account Areas

When the team leader logs into their password-protected account area, their team results are listed on the <u>Team Progress</u> tab, and on the <u>Home</u> tab summary area. Each member's fundraising efforts are also added to the team progress report so that team members can see the results of all team members, and view their standing in relation to their teammates.

Team Emails

All team members have the option to send email to their team members or just to the team leader. The system sends to the team members' email addresses used at registration time, without revealing those addresses to the sender. Team members can also use the email tool to send invitations to join the team.



The most motivating leaders send encouraging messages periodically to remind their teammates of their goal
